

# Rock

There are plenty of times in my life when have looked back and wondered how on earth I got to where I was. At the point of doing this painting I had shifted over from Tasmania where I have lived for 18 years, back home to Victoria.


Three of our four boys had ventured over to 'the main land' for study, and our parents were getting to the age where we needed to closer by as they aged.

We loved the mountains in Tassie, and felt that if we were to move back it needed to have mountain views. So the Dandenong Ranges is where we landed.

I knew only two people apart from my own family. Two special friends who had supported us again and again as a family. I was excited but it was a hard road, building new friends and community. But bit by bit I found my way forward. This painting was one of the first commissions I began in Victoria, a connection through my Dad. At the time of painting I did not have much room to paint, and I was desperate for connection and to find a way to make more money. I had no income and needed to find creative ways to start making money from my art. I had no idea how I was going to do that!

The painting was called 'Rock' because I needed something that was solid in my life. SO much change, moving from the place all my boys grew up to a strange place. I was hoping that the home we were establishing would anchor me down and help me find solid ground for a while.

Painting sure does helps me find myself, and the direction I need to go. It is not without its waves and splashes to make life interesting though!





# Reflect

Take a moment or two to look at this painting. Let its colours seep into your mind, explore the waves and the shoreline. How does it make you feel?	If this was a picture of your future what would it be? In other words what would it be saying to you? What would the creator of it be saying to you? e.g the waves will come but the sun still shines!



### Create 12x12

Depending on what you have at home, print out the previous page, (the ROCK image) or the next page after this and create your own version of it. (if you don't have a computer, you might like to try tracing it from the computer screen even (use it as a light box)!

Create something the size 12 x 12cm. You may use the grid and paint it photo realistically, you might want to sew it, you might want to draw it with pencil, do a collage. or do an abstract version of it. Change it even!

If you want to paint this image in oils and realistically you can go to the link provided in on-line course.

The most important thing is you listen to your heart and do what it says, even if it feels a bit silly or strange. Whatever you create will be absolutely perfect and right!

Over the next few months we will be collecting all of our "Create 12x12s" into a visual journal. I encourage you to find a blank book and place your mini artworks in there and write a short reflection to go with it.



This here is pure white, make sure you touch it up right at the end to be sure it is very bright!

The sky has a touch of magenta in it, be sure to add a wee bit as you mix!




There is quite a bit of grey throughout this piece, when you have placed the dark areas in, fill all the other areas with grey and last of all the lighter highlights

This blue bit here has a bit of turquoise and white in it. It makes the whole wave shine!, Be sure to add the white highlights to the whole painting at the end!

There are a lot of different colours in the sun set on the water! Be sure to add some tiny think dabs of dark bits of orange, blue and red throughout, but don't over do it! You want that golden and spectrum yellow to shine!

#### **ROCK - Brushes**



**Brush sizes are:** 4,6 &8 filbert (with rounded edges) RIgger 0

#### **ROCK - Paint colours**



#### The colours to use for this oil painting are:

Titanium White, Paynes Grey, Golden Yellow, Spectrum Yellow, Magenta, Phthalo Blue, Ultramarine Blue, Turquoise, & Spectrum Red (bright red)
